Rider numbers will be distributed at the team managers' meeting. Attendance at the meeting is restricted to two persons per team.

Timing transponders will be handed out with start numbers. All to be returned immediately after the race to the sport information desk on venue. If not returned a £130 penalty will be applicable per transponder.

Teams will be required to present the vehicle to be used in the race convoy at the team manager meeting. The nation ID decal and race radio will be installed to the vehicle. The vehicle to be used in the race must be in a road worthy condition and suitable for use in the race convoy. Glasgow 2018 reserve the right to refuse any unsuitable vehicle for use in the convoy.

Accreditation

For all four cycling disciplines accreditation cards will be available for collection at the Venue Accreditation Help Office (VAHO) within the Sir Chris Hoy Velodrome, prior to arrival at sport venues and before training commences.

The VAHO will be located at the main entrance of the of the Sir Chris Hoy Velodrome.

Team managers are required to collect the accreditation cards for all team members, including the Member Federation delegates. The team manager will need to confirm their identity at collection, with a passport or national identity card, and sign a confirmation of receipt for all cards received from Glasgow 2018 Accreditation.






PPO for GLG starts at J1A on the M74. Postcode G5 OHD Follow the **PINK PPO** signs to enter the venue.

- Take junction 1A from M74.
- From east take slip road and turn right over motorway. From west take slip road and turn left.
- At T junction take right onto A730.
- Bear left at junction signposted A728.
- Cross the river.
- After Police Scotland Office take left signposted People's Palace.
- At cross road take left onto Kings Drive A74.
- Turn right into park just before bridge over the river.

Hotel locations and parking



Arrival from airports and pick-up service

All accredited delegations, that have booked accommodation through Glasgow 2018 and adhere to booking deadlines, will be provided with return hotel transfers from Glasgow International Airport, which is the specified arrival point for the Championships. Transport will also be provided between accommodation and competition venue during training and competition days.

Venue parking and access

Access to the competition venues will be managed using a Vehicle Access and Parking Permit (VAPP). Those teams that are driving to Glasgow or hiring team vehicles in Glasgow will need to apply for a VAPP by emailing the below information to <u>Glasgow2018Cycling@glasgow.gov.uk</u>

- Type of vehicle
- Number of vehicles
- Venue for which you require access.

The VAPPs, which are free of charge, can be picked up at the VAHO.

Driving in Glasgow

There will be no 'games lanes' or dedicated transport infrastructure to support journey times to and from the venues. However, Glasgow 2018, along with its transport partners, has identified a set of core routes which will have additional monitoring.

Money

The local currency in Great Britain is pound sterling (£). ATM machines can be found outside most banks, supermarkets and transport stations. There may be a charge for withdrawals but you will be notified of any charge prior to making the transaction. Most shops and restaurants accept debit and credit cards.

Team Information

Team parking area

Please note that onsite parking is limited and parking passes will be allocated to teams according to the numbers of riders entered. There is a maximum limit of two passes. Any further vehicles parking should be discussed with the Member Federation Coordinator. Parking passes will be issued at rider confirmation.

Team tents

Team tents will be available from three hours before competition each day. Team tents are allocated based on the size of each team. Due to the large number of people on venue, the space is limited and we ask you to keep to your allocated area. Please ensure equipment does not excessively narrow or block walkways.

Feed zone

The feed zone is located at Greendyke Street, just outside of Glasgow Green start and finish location. Access to the Feed Zone is by foot, as shown in <u>Appendix 1</u>

Doping control

The anti-doping controls will be under the responsibility of UK Anti Doping (UKAD). An official communiqué will be distributed by the appointed DCO.

Anti-doping tests will be carried out by the UKAD Doping Control Officers in accordance with the UCI Regulations.

Chaperons must accompany athletes at all times. Athlete staff should ensure the chaperons are not prevented from observing the athletes.

Riders are reminded that it is their responsibility to report for doping control.

The doping contol station is located next to athlete medical at Glasgow Green.

Rider safety rules

While on the course riders must wear a helmet. The use of personal stereo or Go-Pro camera equipment and headphones, while riding on the course, is forbidden.

Results distribution

Results will be displayed on the noticeboard at sports information and available from www.europeanchampionships.com

Team medical

There is an athlete medical room close to the finish line at Glasgow Green; this will be open at all times that athletes are on venue. There will be a doctor available at the Time Trial start at Riverside Museum if needed. Medical responders will be available on the course.

Radio equipment

All vehicles will be fitted with a magmount antenna connected to a handportable radio and a speaker microphone. There will also be a spare battery supplied. Vehicles will be kitted out on race days at the assembly point, information will be provided at team managers meeting. The cable will be running through the door and into the radio. There will be no wiring required to the vehicles 12v supply.

At the end of each race the equipment will be removed at the finish line location. Please do not leave until the equipment has been removed. There will be a number of radio staff to make this process go as quickly as possible.

All teams are required to provide Glasgow 2018 with details of any radio equipment they intend to operate during the Championships. This is to enable spectrum management between all radio equipment in use during competition to avoid any disruption to event operations, results or broadcast. UK law is very strict regarding radio spectrum usage. Any team using equipment without an appropriate licence will be subject to prosecution and confiscation of the equipment.

As previously instructed in the Cycling Bulletin all teams should have registered their radio equipment by completing the radio spectrum registration form by 30 March 2018. Any applications submitted after this date may not be approved. Teams will be issued with a permit to operate their equipment at the Championships. For information, email: johndundas@dundastech.com

Mixed Zone

Interview mixed zone

At the exit of the course (after the finish line) there will be a mixed zone where media and broadcast can have a short interview with riders. All athletes are required to pass through the mixed zone.

Social media guidelines

Glasgow 2018 encourages and fully supports athletes, as well as other accredited persons, taking part in social media activities throughout the duration of the Championships. Glasgow 2018 want as many athletes and team staff as possible to share their experiences and successes at the Championships. It is worth noting the following: All activities should be in a first-person, diary-type format and not in the role of a journalist, for example, reporting competitions. Posts may not include any information, which is confidential or private, in relation to any other person or organisation. Social media posts and blogs should at all times support the spirit of the Championships and shall not be discriminatory, offensive, hateful, defamatory or otherwise illegal and shall not contain vulgar or obscene words or images.

In addition, they should not:

- Intrude upon the privacy of participants or other accredited persons and entities
- Interfere with the competitions or the ceremonies of the Championships
- Violate security measures.

Photographs

Participants and other accredited individuals may take photographs within the competition venues and post them on social media platforms or websites for personal use. They are not permitted to commercialise, sell or otherwise distribute these photographs.

Accreditation Zones

Accreditation zone privileges are printed on the accreditation card along with the individual's personal information, job title and country name.

Everyone participating in the Glasgow 2018 European Championships will be required to go through specific accreditation access control points to enter an accredited venue. This will be where the venue code on the card is checked.

Once inside the venue, an individual may be required to go through various other access control points to enter internal areas (zones). This is where the access codes (zone numbers) are checked on the accreditation card.

Accreditation must be worn and displayed at all times within an accredited venue.

Road Elite European Championships Specific Regulations

ARTICLE 1: General rules

1.1 The 2018 UEC Road European Championships are organised by the Union Européenne de Cyclisme (UEC) in cooperation with the Glasgow 2018 and the British Cycling Federation.

The technical preparation and coordination will be done by: Glasgow 2018;

Competition Manager Road and Time Trial: Gary Willis

- **1.2** The event will be organised in accordance with rules of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) and these rules will be the reference for everything that is not mentioned in the current document.
- **1.3** The European Road Championships consist of Time Trial races and Road Races are scheduled:

5 August Women's Road Race 8 August Women's and Men's Time Trial 12 August Men's Road Race

These Championships may be contested by riders entered by their National Federation as a National Team.

ARTICLE 2: Type of event

- **2.1** The event is open to athletes of the Men Elite (ME) and Women Elite (WE) categories.
- **2.2** It is entered on the UCI calendar as a Continental Championships event (UCI CC).

ARTICLE 3: Participation

3.1 National Federations may enter the following riders per Championship:

Time Trial – 2 riders per nation/per category

Road Race-Women Elite

UCI Ranking by Nations (published on 1 July 2018)

•	Nations ranked 1 to 5:	8 riders
•	Nations ranked 6 to 10:	6 riders
•	Nations ranked 11 to 20:	4 riders

- Nations ranked 21 to 40: 2 riders
- Nations ranked 41 to 50 or non-ranked nations: 1 rider

Note 1: Unused quota places will be reallocated to nations ranked 11 to 40 and non-ranked countries. Note 2: The hosting nation will be allowed to enter the maximum quota.

Note 3: One quota place will be allocated to non-ranked countries.

Road Race-Men Elite

Cumulative ranking combining the UCI World Ranking by Nations and UCI Europe Tour Ranking by Nation (published on 1 July 2018)

•	Nations ranked 1 to 10:	8 riders
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- Nations ranked 11 to 20: 6 riders
 - Nations ranked 21 to 30: 4 riders
- Nations ranked 31 to 50: 2 riders

Note 1: Unused quota places will be reallocated to nations ranked 11 to 50 and non-ranked countries. Note 2: The hosting nation will be allowed to enter the maximum quota.

Note 3: One quota place will be allocated to non-ranked countries.

- **3.2** For all events the outgoing European Champion can be added to the maximum quota of a National Federation provided that he/she remains eligible for the Championships.
- **3.3** The National Federations have to register their riders directly on the UEC website (<u>www.uec.ch</u>). The registration will open on Friday 6 July 2018. Deadline for the registrations is Friday 20 July 2018, midnight Central European time.

In accordance with the riders' registration, the National Federations may add to the above mentioned numbers of riders:

- max 2 reserve riders per category for Time Trial
- max 4 reserve riders per category for Road Race

The confirmation of the starters and the distribution of the race numbers will take place at the Race Permanence located at the:

The riders to contest each Championship shall be confirmed by an official of their Federation to the Commissaires during the confirmation procedure before the start of the team managers' meeting.

ARTICLE 4: Team managers' meeting-race office

4.1 The Team managers' meetings, organised in accordance with the article 1.2.087 of the UCI regulations in the presence of members of the Commissaires' Panel, are scheduled as follows:

ARTICLE 5: Starting order in Time Trials and start procedure for Road Races

- 5.1 The starting order for the individual Time Trials will be composed by UEC technical delegate in cooperation with the Commissaires and will be communicated after the team managers' meeting at 18:00, as scheduled.
- **5.2** For Road Races, before each race, complete national teams must be present on the presentation podium for the signing of the start sheet. The podium will be open 50 minutes before the start and will close 10 minutes before the start. Riders who fail to sign will not take the start.

ARTICLE 6: Bicycles and equipment control

Time Trials

- **6.1** For the Time Trial races, each bicycle will be checked by the UCI Commissaires. Each rider must present their bicycle for that check and verification at least 15 minutes prior to their personal start time.
- **6.3** During Time Trial races, changing of equipment and technical support is allowed from the team car.

Road Races

During Road Races, changing of equipment and technical support is allowed on every lap passing the boxes, from neutral vehicles and from their team cars.

6.4 The use of any radio communication or other remote means (earpieces, etc.) by or with the riders, as well as the possession of any equipment that can be used in this manner is not allowed.

ARTICLE 7: Radio tour

- 7.1 Race radio information will be broadcasted throughout each race. The allocated frequency will be announced during the team managers' meeting.
- 7.2 Radios will be handed out at the start venue. Each team manager must sign the delivery sheet when receiving and returning the transmitters, as well as pay the security deposit £130. Transmitters must be

returned immediately after each race to the sport information desk at Glasgow Green.

ARTICLE 8: Team cars

- **8.1** Team cars are allowed to the race convoy. In accordance with article 2.2.032 of UCI regulations, the vehicles involved in the races are limited to the maximum height of 1.66m. This rule does not apply in Time Trial races.
- **8.2** For Road Races, the number and the order of cars in the race convoy will be determined by the Commissaires' Panel in accordance with the number of riders at the start as well as road safety criteria, taking in consideration the most recent UCI rankings available per age category.
- **8.3** Teams with a small number of riders will have to share the same car.

ARTICLE 9: Neutral technical support

9.1 The neutral support will be provided by 3 cars and 1 motorbike.

ARTICLE 10: Feeding

10.1 No feeding is allowed during Time Trial races.

- **10.2** For Road Races, feeding is allowed starting from the 3rd lap until the last lap (not included) each time passing the feeding zone boxes, as well as from team cars and neutral cars.
- **10.3** The feeding zone is located on Greendyke street.

ARTICLE 11: Finishing time limits

- **11.1** There is no time limit for Time Trial races. On Road Races, all overlapped riders will be eliminated.
- **11.2** In accordance with the UCI regulations, art. 2.3.039, any rider who is dropped behind and lapped by the lead riders before they start their final lap shall be eliminated and must leave the race. All other riders shall be classified in accordance with their position.

ARTICLE 12: Awards ceremonies

- **12.1** In accordance with article 1.2.112 of the UCI Regulations, the 3 best riders of each category must attend the official awards ceremony and press conference.
- **12.2** For the Time Trial events, a 'hot-seat' zone for the best 3 times will be prepared near the finish line.

For the Road Races, riders must present themselves at the podium within a maximum of 10 minutes after crossing the finish line.

ARTICLE 13: Points scale

In accordance with the articles 2.10.008 and 2.10.017 of the UCI ranking points for the UCI Europe Tour WE and ME categories are awarded as follows:

ARTICLE 16: Penalties


16.1 The UCI penalty scale is the only one applicable.

ARTICLE 17: Responsibilities


- **17.1** The organisers and UEC will not, under any circumstances, be liable to any accidents or damage that occurs during training and competitions.
- **17.2** The organisers and UEC decline all responsibilities towards the riders and others in case of an accident.

For all cases not covered by these specific regulations, the UCI rules will apply. Any problems will be solved between the organisers, the Commissaires' Panel and UEC officials.





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
