

6. EVENT SPECIFIC REGULATIONS

<u>Article 1 - GENERAL RULES</u>

- The Union Européenne de Cyclisme in cooperation with the local organising committee (LOC) will 1.1 organize the 2024 UEC Cyclo-Cross European Championships held on 1-3 November in Pontevedra (Spain).
- 1.2 The events will be organized in accordance with the rules of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) and these rules will be the reference for everything that is not mentioned in the current document.
- The Championships (Junior/U23/Elite) may be contested by riders entered by their National 1.3 Federation as a National Team.
- Entrants for European Championships shall hold licenses issued by a Federation affiliated to the 1.4 UEC and have the nationality of the Federation doing the entry.
- The riders (Junior/U23/Elite) to contest each Championship shall be confirmed by an official of 1.5 their Federation to the Commissaires during the confirmation procedure, before the start of the Team Managers meeting.
- Riders ages shall be calculated as defined by the UCI rules (5.1.001). Junior and U23 riders 1.6 cannot race with elite during the European Championships, except U23 riders approved by the UCI to upgrade to the Elite category.
 - Note that this upgrade is valid for the Cyclo-cross discipline only. In Cyclo-cross, those riders will never recover the Under 23 status, for the rest of their career.

1.7 Body numbers - Clothes

The riders are obliged to use the body-numbers which will be supplied by the organization. Changes to these and clothes are not allowed. Riders must compete in their national jersey (where applicable).

1.8 Unforeseen

In those cases in which the regulations do not specify, the commissaires panel, in conjunction with the UEC Technical delegate and the organization (where applicable), will decide.

Article 2 - TYPE OF THE EVENTS

2.1 Categories

2.2 UCI Individual classification

According to Appendix 4 of UCI rules, riders will receive the points corresponding to UCI Cyclocross individual classification.

Article 3 - PARTICIPATION

NATIONAL TEAMS (JUNIORS, U23 AND ELITE)

- **3.1** National Federations may enter the following riders per Championship:
 - √ 8 riders per nation and per category
 - √ 4 reserve riders per nation and per category
- **3.2** The National Federations have to register their **riders** (Juniors/U23/Elite) on the UEC website https://uec.evodata.it/landing/index.php

The registration opens: Monday, 2 September 2024 (12:00 CET). Deadline for the registration: Friday, 25 October 2024, (23:59 CET)

Staff and NF Official Delegates will need to register on https://uec.getyourevent.online/

3.3 Attendants

Each rider may be accompanied by a paramedical assistant and two mechanics.

The paramedical assistant and the mechanics must be provided by the organizer with a bracelet, which gives them access to the start / finish zone or the pit area.

Important

National coaches are asked to prepare in advance the list of assistants working with riders in the start / finish area and in the pit area.

This list can be found on UEC website and should be returned to <u>v.petsas@uec.ch</u> for the pre-check of assistants' licenses (template form: 2024 UEC Cyclo-Cross European Champs NF registration teams assistants).

Only those declared assistants will be allowed to receive bracelets to access the start / finish zone or the pit area.

The bracelets must be worn by the people confirmed by the National Coach or National Team Manager, he carries this responsibility. These bracelets give access to the course without accreditation.





MASTER CATEGORIES

3.4. Master categories

Masters registration will need to be done through the online registration

Entry fee:

The hereafter conditions will be applied for the participation of the 2024 UEC Cyclo-Cross Masters European Championships:

• € 40 from 7 February to 31 May 2024

• € 50 from 1 June to 31 August 2024

• € 60 from 1 September to 25 October 2024

Entry on the day is not available.

Registration:

The registration will open on Friday, 7 February (18:00 CET)

Deadline for registration and payment: Thursday, 25 October (12:00 CET)

Article 4 - START ORDER

The start order for ME, MU, MJ, WE, WU and WJ categories will be as follows:

As per the most recently published UCI cyclo-cross individual classification of the current season.

Unclassified riders by nations in rotation as follows:

- For unclassified riders, the start order within the team must be confirmed by the national federations during riders confirmation.
- Taking each nation in turn on the basis of the classification by nation of the concerned category from the world championships of the previous season, a place shall be allocated to the next rider in sequence;
- Federations which do not appear in the classification by nation specified above shall, on the basis of the same rotation system, take the last places, in an order determined by drawing lots.

The start order for all Master categories will be as follows:

- Defending 2023 European champion of the category concerned.
- According to the order of the on-line registration

<u>Article 5 – ALLOCATION OF START NUMBERS</u>

Men Elite, Men Under 23, Men Junior, Women Elite, Women Under 23 and Women Junior

Race numbers in sequence from 1 upwards are allocated to the national federation of the 2023 European Champion in the concerned category.

Other numbers are allocated to national federations according to the ranking of their best individual ranked rider in 2023 European Championships.

For nations not ranked or not having taken part in the 2023 European Championships the preceding season, the allocation shall be done by drawing lots by the commissaires' panel.

All Master categories

Race numbers are allocated according to the order of the on-line registration.

<u>Article 6 – ALLOCATION OF BOXES IN THE PITS AREA</u>

The pit boxes are allocated the day prior to the continental championships during the team managers meeting as follows:





ME, MU, MJ, WE, WU and WJ categories

- 1. Separately for each category on the basis of the most recently published UCI cyclo-cross ranking by nation of the current season for the category concerned (or the final ranking of the previous season if no ranking has yet been published for the current season);
- 2. The allocation of boxes to teams that do not feature in the relevant ranking shall be by drawing lots;
- 3. The president of the commissaires' panel shall prepare per category the number of pits allocated to each nation, taking into account the number of riders. Three boxes maximum will be allocated to one nation. Nations with a small number of riders may be grouped in the same box:
- 4. The national team managers shall select their preferred boxes in the order determined by points 1 and 2. Any nation that is allocated 2 or 3 boxes must chose the numbers of these boxes back to back;
- 5. In case of absence of reply of the team manager or blocked situation, the president of the commissaires panel shall fix the relevant boxes allocation. The final distribution of boxes per nation will be communicated to teams and commissaires.

All Master categories

For each category the pit boxes are not allocated and are free to use according to own discretion of mechanics.

Article 7 - CLOTHING

All riders of **ME, MU, MJ, WE WU and WJ categories** must start in their national jerseys (art.1.3.059).

The World Champions must start with their rainbow jersey.

The advertisements on jerseys have to be in conformity with art. 1.3.057 of UCI regulations.

Each Team Manager must present the national clothing (jersey and shorts or the national skinsuit) to the commissaires' panel at the starter's confirmation and issuing of start numbers.

For the riders <u>Master Men and Master Women categories</u> design of jersey or advertising are not limited except of the UCI World champion jersey.





Article 8 - CYCLO-CROSS TEAM RELAY UEC EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

8.1 Participation, Registration

For the team relay, each nation may enter only one team. Each National Team shall be made up of:

- 1 Men Elite or 1 Men Under 23,
- 1 Men Under 23 or 1 Men Junior,
- 1 Men Junior,
- 1 Women Elite or 1 Women Under 23,
- 1 Women Under 23 or 1 Women Junior,
- 1 Women Junior.

Incomplete teams are not allowed. One rider cannot race in more than 1 of the above-listed categories. Each rider selected must already be entered for the individual UCI Cyclo-cross World Championships events.

The registration of nations to the Cyclo-cross Team Relay event will be as following:

- by Friday 18 October 2024, 09h00 CET: reply of nations to the participation intention form ("yes", "no", "do not know yet") by e-mail to: v.petsas@uec.ch
- by Friday 25 October 2024, 16h00 CET: registration of nations with 6 riders by e-mail to: v.petsas@uec.ch
- by Thursday 31 October 2024 at 16h30 CET: team composition and start order must be confirmed by e-mail to: v.petsas@uec.ch

The Team Manager must use the form provided to notify the names and categories of the riders making up their team and their start order to the chief commissaire's panel before the above-mentioned deadline. The start order may not be altered subsequently.

8.2 Bib Numbers, Gridding, Start

The order of Nations is drawn based on the results of the team relay event in the preceding UEC European Championships.

For the 2024 UEC Cyclo-cross European Championships, the results of the Cyclo-cross Team Relay event of the 2024 UCI Cyclo-cross World Championships, Tabor (CZE) will be taken as reference.

The order of Nations not placed will be determined by drawing lots.

This order of Nations for the UEC European Championships team relay shall determine the following elements:

- the order of Nations on the entry list and the allocation of bibs numbers: the first nation will receive the number 1A, 1B, 1C, 1D, 1E, 1F, the second nation the number 2A, 2B, 2C, 2D, 2E, 2F, and so on;
- the call-up order of the first riders to start the team relay: the first rider to start of the nation number 1 of the order will be called first, then the first rider to start of the nation number 2, and so on;
- the number of the start box of the relay zone;
- the number of the pit box of the pit area.

Teams are responsible for determining the order of riders and for their timely presence in the relay zone.

8.3 Team Relay Race

Riders waiting for the relay will have the opportunity to stay sheltered in a tent near the relay area. This space will be heated in case of low temperature or wet weather. The timely arrival of the rider in the relay zone remains the responsibility of the national team.

Each rider shall race during one complete lap of the course used for the individual races of the UEC European Championships. At the end of his lap and in the official relay zone, he shall give the relay to the next teammate.

The finishing rider must touch the hand, arm or shoulder of the next racing rider, when he/she is standstill in the relay box. No flying relay shall be accepted. When he/she is touched by the finishing rider, the next racing rider can start and ride his/her lap.





If the rider finishing his/her relay passes his teammate without touching him, he/she must immediately make a u-turn and come back to the box allocated to his nation. The riders racing after the last relay shall finish their lap by crossing the finish line of the venue.

The information of the logistic conditions of the Relay zone (location of relay boxes, location of warm-up and waiting boxes) will be communicated to National Federations between <u>21 and 28 October 2024</u>.

8.4 Pit Area

4 Mechanics per nation will be allowed in the pit area, they will receive a bracelet that will give access to the pit area for the Team Relay only.

The boxes allocation will be allocated following the above-mentioned order of Nations: the Nation 1 receive the box nr 1, the Nation 2 the box nr 2 and so on...

8.5 Awards Ceremony, Prizes

The 6 riders of each of the 3 first ranked nations will have to present to the Team Relay UEC Cyclo-cross European Championships awards ceremony. The riders of the 1st nation will all receive one UEC European Champion jersey. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to the 18 riders following their Nations' rank.

UCI points are allocated to the nation's women elite and men elite rankings only and not to the riders individually. A minimum of 5 nations must compete in the cyclo-cross team relay for UCI points to be awarded.

Article 9 – OTHER UCI-RULES

- 1. Wearing a rigid safety helmet shall be mandatory during competitions and training sessions.
- 2. Bicycles used for Cyclo-Cross races must comply with UCI regulations.
- 3. For the Cyclo-Cross bicycle the width of the tyres (measured between the widest parts) shall not exceed 33 mm and it may not incorporate any form of spike or stud (1.3.018).
- 4. Using of disc brakes are allowed in cyclo-cross training and competition (1.3.025).
- 5. For races on the road and cyclo-cross, the use of fixed sprocket is forbidden: a braking system that acts on both wheels is required.
- 6. Personal high-pressure cleaners are forbidden in the pit area during the continental cyclo-cross championships.
- 7. UCI cyclo-cross teams
 - The European Championships is a competition raced by National Teams and not by Trade Teams.
 - UCI cyclo-cross teams registered with the UCI receive 2 accreditations for the team managers zone in the pit area and 2 parking passes so that Teams' management may assist to the UEC European Championships.
 - The parking pass for UCI Cyclo-cross Teams will not give access to the National Teams parking.
 - If one vehicle must access to the National Teams parking, it must be integrated in the list of vehicles for that National Team by the National coach.





Article 10 - AWARD CEREMONIES / JERSEY & MEDALS

Every European Championship will be awarded for:

The 1st place: Champion(s) jersey and Gold medal

The 2nd place: Silver medal The 3rd place: Bronze medal

Within 10 minutes following the end of each race (unless otherwise provided and duly recorded in an official communiqué), the European Champion, as well as the second and the third placed riders shall be ready for the official ceremony that will be held after each race in the finish area.

Riders ME, MU, MJ, WE WU, WJ and Master categories shall appear in racing attire, wearing their national jerseys but bare-headed and without headband or glasses, until they leave the official ceremony enclosure.

The prize money will be transferred by the UEC directly to the concerned National Federations by mid-November.

Article 12 - ANTIDOPING

The UCI antidoping regulations are entirely applicable to the event.

The antidoping controls will be under the responsibility of the ITA (International Testing Agency) and CELAB (Comisión Española para la Lucha Antidopaje en el Deporte).

Article 13 - PENALTIES

The UCI penalty scale is the only one applicable.

Article 14 - RESPONSIBILITIES

The Organizer and the UEC will not, under any circumstances, be liable to any accidents or damage that occurs during training and competitions.

The Organizer and the UEC decline all responsibilities towards the riders and others in case of an accident. For all cases not covered by these specific regulations, the UCI rules will apply. Any problems will be solved between the organizers, the Commissaires Panel and UEC officials.
